October is medical ultrasound awareness month and we are off to a running start with the USSONAR 2025-2026 Fundamentals of Musculoskeletal Ultrasound Program using our new educational platform Canvas. Our program director Phil Chu MD, RhMSUS, assistant program director Erin Chew MD, RhMSUS, along with the education committee Samar Aboulenain MBBCh, RhMSUS and Jane Nishio MD, RhMSUS have worked tirelessly to implement an updated curriculum with the help of our USSONAR faculty mentors Jen Medlin, Michelene Hearsh Holmes, Janeth Vinh, Fawad Aslam, Ed Oberle, and Patty Vega-Fernandes, and oversight from our vice president Jonathan Samuels. Thanks also to Dan Malone for creating extra procedural educational content for our Fundamentals class; and a shout out to Eva Rottmann and Seth VanDerVeer for their excellent Ultrasound Pitfalls webinar created for our new class, as well as the broader rheumatology online community. This 2025-2026 year

was another record year of applications and we wish we could have taken everyone; this year we expanded our class and accepted a total of 91 overall participants, including **70 total fellows** (60 adult and 10 pediatric participants) to the full program, which started this month. 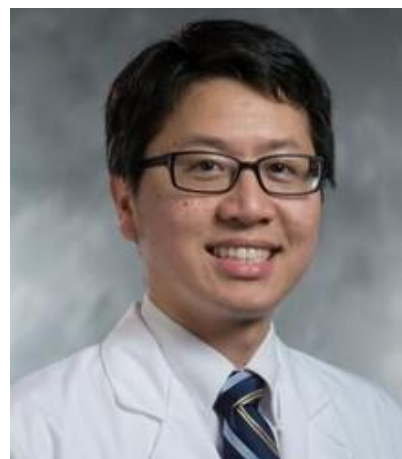
## Membership Spotlight | By Dr. Zineb Aouhab

This newsletter we are putting the spotlight on the new upcoming Fundamentals Program Director Dr. Philip Chu

**Dr. Zineb Aouhab**

### **How did MSK US impact your career as an rheumatologist?**

USSONAR was the highlight of my 2nd year of fellowship! The pathology scavenger hunt led to me to seek out multiple attendings to scan their patients, which really publicized my interest and growing expertise in MSK US. Fast forward to present. In our rheumatology ultrasound clinics, we receive referrals from our colleagues. The opportunity to interact with multiple rheumatologists and trying to help with solving interesting cases has been very enjoyable. My colleagues are very appreciative, and I get to see high-yield interesting cases.

MSK US is also a very useful tool for education. US has also provided many opportunities for teaching fellows and residents, and has made education a major part of my career.

### **How did ultrasound training prepare you to practice rheumatology?**

MSKUS has been very helpful in learning anatomy and better correlating the physical exam with disease manifestations. The ability for immediate imaging feedback allowed me to better hone my physical exam skills paired with MSKUS in the same visit. Instead of just palpating “joints,” I am able to palpate for synovitis, osteophytes, or enthesitis.

### **What are some of the challenges you may have faced implementing ultrasound in your practice? How did you overcome them?**

There was the initial hope that MSK US as an imaging modality could easily serve as the gold standard final answer, but I have found (as a common theme in medicine and rheumatology) that there still remains many gray areas.

As several examples: even with seemingly crystalline deposits, this does not guarantee gout vs CPPD; even if there are classic findings and locations for CPPD, this does not guarantee that it is responsible for the entire picture of inflammatory arthritis; even if there is enthesopathy, this does not separate between mechanical and inflammatory spondyloarthropathy etiologies. Thus I often find that while hoping for further MSK US clarification, there are more follow up questions being asked.

The radiology report phrase “clinically correlate” remains relevant. Thus I often find myself going back full circle to the details of the history and bigger picture again to arrive at the differential conclusions.

Having a network of colleagues to discuss these cases is very helpful. Many questions, such as “have you seen X finding in Y scenario?” or “The textbook says X, this but can Y be possible?” are fun to ask and get an idea for the range of possibilities and make this a group learning experience!

### **How do you imagine the future of MSK US?**

At our institution, we have been piloting AI scribes, which has amazingly transformed my workflow. It allows me to start scanning the patient early on in the clinic visit without worrying about writing additional important history that come up when discovering synovitis on scanning and tenderness on sonopalpation. I do not have to worry about running behind when deciding to roll out the MSK US machine. I think with more universal adoption of AI scribes, we can become more efficient in diagnostic US in the near future.

As MSK US training and clinical use becomes more widely available, I hope to see more adoption of MSK US as a biomarker in clinical trials. In my clinical experience, I find that the physical examination can sometimes be equivocal, and patients with subtle synovitis, patients on active immunosuppression and prednisone, patients with fibromyalgia or higher BMI's can limit the accuracy of the physical exam, which can dilute the outcomes in current clinical trials.
