Dear Ultrasound Friends,

Happy Fall! Did you know that October is Medical Ultrasound Awareness Month? Originally created to raise public awareness of the medical uses of ultrasound. It's a chance for you as members of USSONAR to help promote the value of ultrasound use in rheumatology. If you are on social media, I encourage you to share how you use ultrasound in your daily practice or how ultrasound has positively impacted the care of one of your patients, and tag @USSONAR_Rh on X, Linked In, or Facebook.

October also marks the start of our 2024-2025 Fundamentals Musculoskeletal Ultrasound program led by Dr. Norm Madsen (URMC), along with Michelene Hearth-Holmes (UNMC). We're off to a great start with a record number of 115 rheumatologists who participated in the September application/eligibility month. We have our largest class to-date with a total of 75 participants accepted into the full program: 56 fellows (with 3 from peds rheum), and 19 non-fellow participants (2 from peds rheum). Planning is already underway for the February 2025 Fundamentals Hands-on Course in Tampa, Florida led by USSONAR Vice President Dr. Jonathan Samuels (NYU) and USSONAR Fundamentals Education Committee member Dr. Jen Medlin (UNMC). In addition to scanning normal and pathologic joints with our expert faculty, we are happy to announce the return of our cadaver injection lab to the Fundamentals program.

In order to accommodate the larger class, we have also expanded our USSONAR faculty mentor readers to 84. Thanks to all of our dedicated mentors for their expert image feedback and teaching of scanning pearls and pitfalls.



Dr. Canella has been a longtime USSONAR faculty mentor, and also served on the USSONAR board in the past as treasurer, secretary and vice president. She currently serves on the USSONAR research committee and has numerous publications including those related to ultrasound education. Dr. Cannella is a pioneer in teaching and implementing rheum ultrasound

into rheumatology fellowship training and one of the authors of the ACR 2019 Rheumatology Ultrasound Curriculum -supplemental guide to the ACR rheumatology core curriculum.



Membership Spotlight | By Dr. Zineb Aouhab

In this newsletter we are introducing the new USSONAR **Membership Spotlight** where Dr. Aouhab, will interview our featured USSONAR member.

This week we are featuring Dr. Natalie A. Faith, with Florida Medical Clinic Orlando Health.

Dr. Zineb Aouhab

How did the use ultrasound impact your career as a rheumatologist?

• I have been in private practice as a rheumatologist since 2008. I started MSK US training in 2011 and was the first rheumatologist to incorporate MSK US into my practice in 2012. We have portable machines for point of care diagnostics and injections. We also have in-house sonographers who perform diagnostic US scans for evaluation of synovitis, enthesitis, gout, and salivary glands. I also have also trained one of our sonographers to scan for GCA. When we developed RA and PsA treatment pathways in 2016 and 2017 respectively, we decided to incorporate positive MSK US results as a requirement before starting a 1st time biologic or tsDMARD as a way to improve value of care and improve success of my clinic's ACO.

We also track MSK US response to different therapies as structured data and use this information when making therapeutic decisions as treat to target approach. I have a particular interest in enthesitis. I have taught an ACR workshop on enthesitis and PsA, and have contributed to an editorial in the Journal of Rheumatology. I have helped teach MSK US to rheumatology fellows in office, via lecture, and at an US workshop. More recently, I became a member of the USSONAR Bylaws committee and helped recruit patient models for a USSONAR multitrack course. I will be the next USSONAR Bylaws committee chair which will allow me the honor to serve on the USSONAR board.

How did ultrasound training prepare you to practice rheumatology?

• I earned RhMSUS certification in 2013 and RMSK certification in 2016. It has made a huge difference in my ability to make accurate diagnoses as well as offering additional therapeutic options with US guided injections. Being able to identify Doppler positive enthesitis on US has really helped more accurately identify SpA patients. I have identified many inflammatory arthritis patients with gout as the primary or secondary cause. Knowing sonoanatomy well improves my ability to diagnose inflammatory and non- inflammatory joint diseases without US.

What are some of the challenges you may have faced implementing ultrasound in your practice? How did you overcome them?

- I first started performing MSK myself using a portable US machine and dictating the results to my in house medical scribe. My partners saw the lengthy US scan time as a barrier to patient access to care. So we shortly hired our 1st MSK sonographer and currently have 3 MSK sonographers and 3 premium US machines.
- For several years, one of our sonographers was scanning temporal and axillary arteries for GCA
 evaluation. Due to reimbursement issues, we can no longer perform that protocol in house. I am
 currently training a cardiology-based sonographer to perform the protocol and have a
 cardiologist colleague provide the report.

How do you imagine the future of MSK US?

I would like to see the use of AI increase ability to accurately read and report MSK US studies to
improve reporting efficiency. This is particularly important in private practice. I am curious to see
how results of US guided synovial biopsy will impact inflammatory arthritis therapeutic decisions
if it becomes more widely available apart from research settings.
